This article discusses the insights of Makassar Muslim scholars regarding environmental theology concerning Islamic Jurisprudence. It employs qualitative research methodology through observation, interview, and document collection. The research found that Makassar Muslim scholars strongly perceived environmental theology as an alternative solution to ecological crises. They believe that two primary sources of Islam, the Quran, and Hadith, pay great attention to protecting and maintaining an environment. Many verses in the Quran promote the importance of keeping the environment. Prophet Muhammad is the best practice among leaders strongly concerned about the environment. It also found that environmental theology has a strong relationship with Islamic Jurisprudence.
